### Key vocabulary

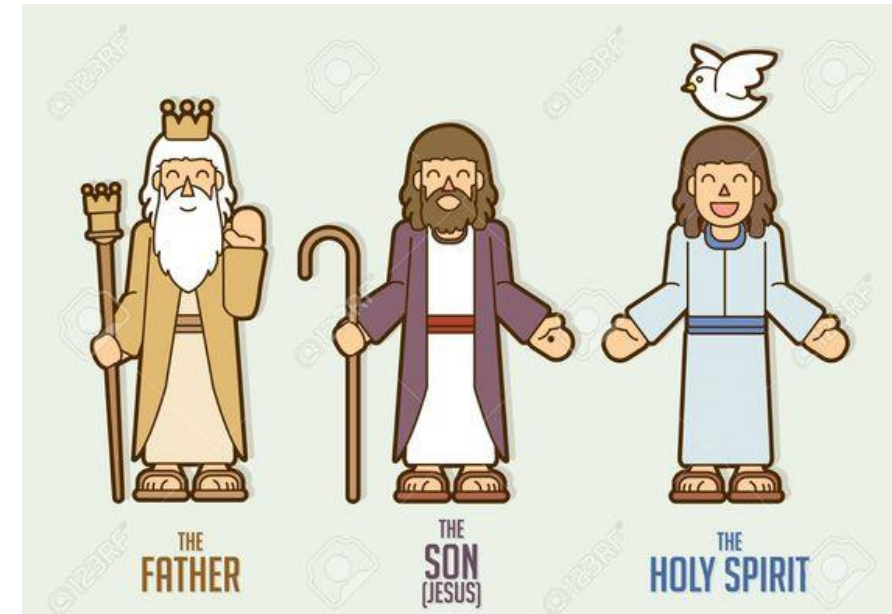
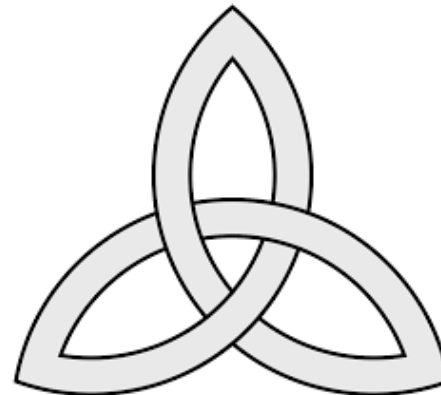
<b>Christian</b>	Someone who believes in Christianity.
<b>Holy Trinity</b>	The Father, The Son and the Holy Spirit.
<b>Gospel</b>	The teaching of Christ.
<b>Baptism</b>	The Christian religious rite of sprinkling water onto a person's forehead or immersing them in water.
<b>Prayer</b>	A solemn request for help or expression of thanks addressed to God.

### Meaning of Gospel

- “Gospel” means “Good News”
- The New Testament Greek word “*evangelion*” means “Good Message.”

The Bible refers to *the gospel* as “the gospel,” “the gospel of the Kingdom of God,” “The gospel of Christ,” and “the gospel of God.”

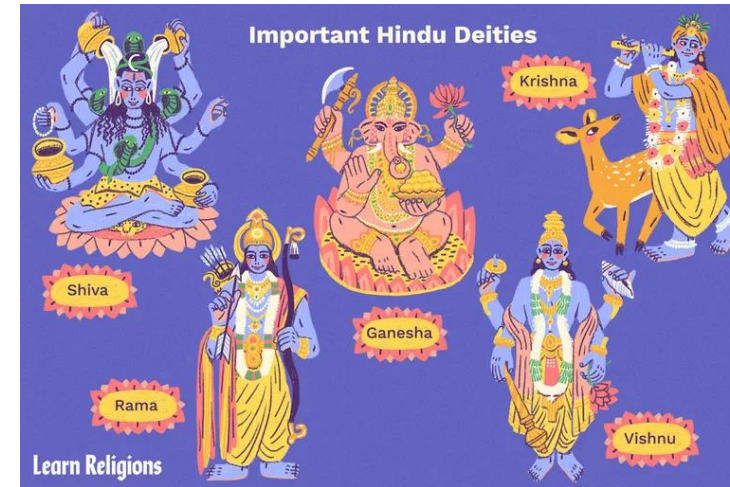

## Concept – shared symbols and rituals

Key Vocabulary	
<b>Hindu</b>	Someone who believes in Hinduism.
<b>Aum</b>	Symbolises the Universe and the ultimate reality. It is the most important Hindu symbol.
<b>Symbol</b>	A mark used as a representation of an object.
<b>Brahman</b>	The first god in the Hindu trimurti.
<b>Deities</b>	Gods and goddesses in Hinduism.
<b>Trimurti</b>	Three gods Brahma, Vishnu and Shiva.
<b>Qualities</b>	A distinctive attribute or characteristic possessed by someone.
<b>Shrine</b>	A place containing a religious statue or other object.
<b>Puja</b>	The act of worship.
<b>Diwali</b>	A Hindu festival with lights, held in October to November.

# RE Knowledge Organiser Year 4: Why do Christians call the day Jesus died 'Good Friday'?

## Concept – Ultimate questions

Key Vocabulary	
<b>Sin</b>	Offence against God – something bad.
<b>Holy Week</b>	The week between Palm Sunday and Easter.
<b>Palm Sunday</b>	The Sunday before Easter that celebrates Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem.
<b>Good Friday</b>	The Friday before Easter commemorating the crucifixion of Jesus and his death.
<b>Easter Sunday</b>	Commemorating the resurrection of Jesus from the dead.
<b>Salvation</b>	Preservation from harm, ruin or loss.



The egg, an ancient symbol of new life, has been associated with pagan festivals celebrating spring. From a Christian perspective, Easter eggs are said to represent Jesus' emergence from the tomb and resurrection.





# RE Knowledge Organiser Year 4: For Christians, when Jesus left, what was the impact of Pentecost?

Concept – shared symbols and rituals

## Key Vocabulary

<b>Pentecost</b>	<p>The Christian holy day of Pentecost, which is celebrated fifty days after Easter Sunday, commemorates the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles and other followers of Jesus Christ while they were in Jerusalem celebrating the Feast of Weeks.</p> <p>It is to remember the coming of the Holy Spirit to the apostles and other followers of Jesus. 3,000 people were baptized that day. It is also the churches birthday.</p>
<b>Holy spirit</b>	<p>The third part of the Trinity, God as spiritually active in the world.</p>
<b>Resurrection</b>	<p>The Christian belief that Christ rose from the dead.</p>
<b>Apostles</b>	<p>The twelve chief disciples of Jesus Christ.</p>

<b>Sanatan Dharma</b>	What some Hindus call their religion it means 'Eternal Way' this describes a way of life rather than a set of beliefs.
<b>Dharma</b>	Describes a Hindu's way of life, there is no separation between their religious, social and moral duties.
<b>Shrine</b>	A place containing a religious statue or other object.
<b>Deities</b>	Gods and goddesses.
<b>Aum</b>	Symbolises the Universe and the ultimate reality. It is the most important Hindu symbol.
<b>Puja</b>	The act of worship.
<b>Rituals</b>	Something you repeat regularly.
<b>Tradition</b>	A long-establish custom or belief that has been passed on from one generation to another.
