

NEWS FROM FARTHING WOOD:

This week, Farthing Wood class have begun to explore measures - converting between metric units and Year 6 have enjoyed getting to grips with Algebra.

In English, we have begun exploring paragraphs and features of biographical texts. The children have also enjoyed our new handwriting & spelling challenges; including our new Word of the Week feature on our Graffiti wall. This week's word is Ramshackle. Children explored the definitions, antonyms and synonyms for this new word, as well as, trying to include their new vocabulary in their work.

In Science, we have continued our work on our topic Electric Art - children are now designing their Art installations which will include electrical components.

NEWS FROM HUNDRED ACRE WOOD:

This week in Hundred Acre Wood Class we have been looking at height and length in Math's. We have enjoyed exploring the school environment measuring and comparing objects using blocks, centimeters and meters. In KSI English we have started to look at The Night Gardner by the Fan Brothers and Jack and the Beanstalk in Reception. The children's costumes for world book day have been fabulous. We have talked about what book they are from and why they like this book.
