On Friday pupils were back with Mrs Harris practicing their keyboards and flutes and Sally Butlin joined Trewidland for a whole School fun packed music session.

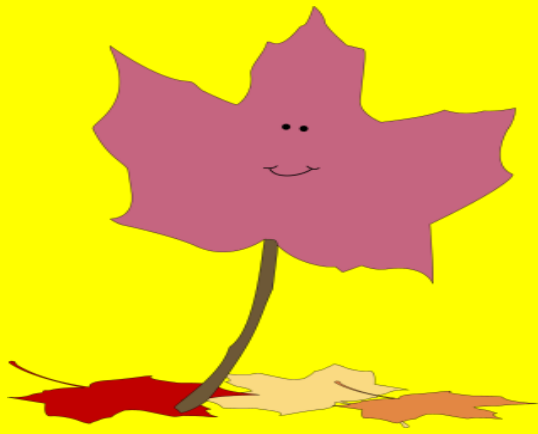
